Many thanks to those who assisted in setting, painting and recovering the targets. HPRMS is a tough shooting match and physically challenging when setting up and recovering the silhouettes. The SBRMS (Small Bore Rifle Metal Silhouettes) will continue to be setup for organized practice during the HPRMS matches. This will hopefully evolve into a match held concurrently with the HPRMS.

There will be a few changes for the next match on OCT. 17th:

- 1. Four Shooters who help set up and take down targets before, during, and after the match will receive a \$4 rebate on their entry fee. Set up time is 0800. If there is no one to help, then there will not be a match.
- 2. The entire Silhouette Range firing-line will be closed to the public during Match Operations.
