NATIONAL

Right to Carry Reciprocity Bill (H.R. 822)

Rep. Cliff Stearns (R-FL) and Rep. Heath Shuler (D-NC) introduced H.R 822 in the U.S. House of Representatives. This bill "would allow any person with a valid state-issued Right-to-Carry permit to carry a concealed firearm in any state that issues Right-to-Carry permits, or that does not prohibit the carrying of concealed firearms for lawful purposes" (Source: *America's 1st Freedom*, May 2011, p. 16).
