- 5. Patch and repaint the small storage building. Hopefully the USPSA shooters will take this on with help from the city if needed.
- 6. Clean up the back of the building. (More plastic was uncovered when the dirt was needed to level the ground before the gravel was put down.)
- 7. Dirt needs to be blown off the gravel around the new patio tables. (Cindy has a leaf blower that can be borrowed.)
- 8. Extend the sidewalk at the silhouette range. (At this time we do not have enough money in the range account for this project.)
